On May 13, 2020, the Washington State Department of Labor & Industries (L&I) in conjunction with the Department of Health responded to the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic by adopting WAC 246-358-002-Temporary worker housing. This new section is to protect occupants from COVID-19 hazards in licensed temporary worker housing.

All growers, who wish to house their workers at the Oroville Harvest Shelter will be required to sign the following Lease Addendum. The Lease Addendum specifies the duties and responsibilities of each party.

Lease Addendum to Seasonal Housing Lease Agreement

OHA duties:

1. Submit to the Department of Health a revised temporary worker housing management plan that demonstrates how the temporary housing provider will comply with the emergency rule requirements;
2. Educate occupants in a language understood by the occupants on COVID-19;
3. Provide an adequate supply of single use hand soap;
4. Provide an adequate supply of single use paper towels;
5. Disposable gloves to OHA staff and occupants for cleaning;
6. Ensure daily cleaning and disinfecting of surfaces in the common trailers.

Grower / Employer duties:

1. Require the workers to report all illnesses or symptoms associated with COVID-19 they are experiencing or have experienced within the last seven days;
2. Report to the OHA designated point of contact any workers who have made a report of illness or symptoms;
3. Ensure all workers required to be placed in isolation or quarantine status are provided with appropriate care. Appropriate care includes, and is not limited to, transportation, medical care, testing, and meals.
4. Educate the worker about sick leave programs available to the worker should they become ill. Such education will encourage workers to report all illnesses and symptoms of COVID-19 to the employer.
5. Screen occupants with symptoms
6. Provide each occupant with a thermometer or a trained designee to perform daily temperature checks of all occupants
7. Provide occupant transportation to a medical facility for any medical evaluation.
8. Contact the Okanogan County Community Action Council for offsite isolation housing if occupant requires isolation or to be quarantine, or provide alternative housing which meets Department of Health requirements.
9. Monitor the occupant's medical status
10. Provide adequate supply of face masks as required by L&I.

- 11. Provide an adequate supply of EPA approved disinfectant or diluted bleach solution, clean sponges, and / or disinfectant wipes for frequent cleaning and disinfecting of surfaces in the sleeping trailers.
- 12. Provide hand sanitizer.
